Plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.

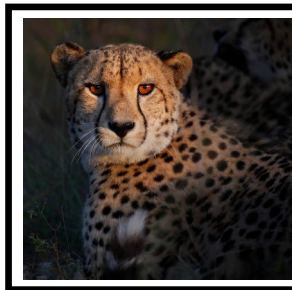
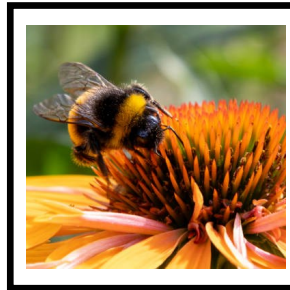
Plants can form some or most of our diet.

Most plants come from seeds which will grow given the right conditions.

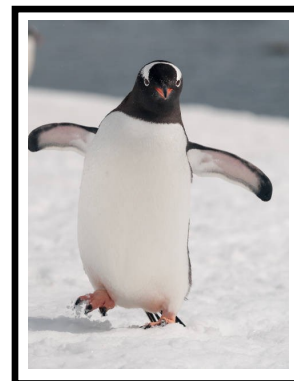


Key facts about habitats

A habitat is the home of an animal or a plant.

Almost every place on Earth, from the hottest desert to the coldest ice pack, is a habitat for some kinds of animals and plants.

A habitat is when food, water, shelter and space go together in a special way, so that animals including people, can live.



Key facts about animals

Animals need air so that they can breathe, water and food to survive, and shelter so that they are protected from the environment and also from predators.

Invertebrates are animals which do not have a skeleton and vertebrates have a skeleton or backbone inside their bodies.

The five classes of animals are mammals, birds, fish, reptiles, amphibians and insects.
